We had a wonderful week welcoming back both our in-person and distance-learning students. I look forward to the New Year and to our spring semester! I am hopeful the pandemic will move in a positive direction and we will begin to see some normalcy in our lives again. I know that this is what we are all hopeful for!

I received some exciting news of the Winter Break. I had applied for a \$10,000.00 Grant to the Van Sickle Foundation. We found out the 2nd week of break that we did receive this grant, which was wonderful news for our students and staff. The grant was written to reinstate our Dreambox and Accelerated Reader licenses. Both license combined are well over \$10,000.00 and this was a VERY WELCOMED gift from this foundation since we have had to look towards alternative funding this year for some of the programs we use on campus. As soon as both of these programs are up and running, your child's teacher will let you know.



We just completed our Winter MAP testing for our in-person learning students. In the weeks to come, we will be MAP testing our Distance Learners and our Kinder students in Reading as well. We will also be ACCESS testing our ELL students. Both assessments are truly helping to support teachers in their instruction and interventions. We have seen many benefits with our smaller class sizes due to capacity guidelines and our Distance Learners too, are excelling in their home environment and learning platform.

We have our Annual Fund the Arts Fundraiser coming too! This year will be very different, but very exciting! Our committee is working very hard to get creative in our planning efforts and there are exciting things in store for all of us. # Dual Language Program

It takes 5-7 years for full language acquisition to take place. If your child is in the Dual Language Program, that means he/she will be at the brink of fluency upon graduation from elementary school. This means that language study and practice need to be continued and supported in middle school and beyond for full fluency into adulthood. If your child is not in the Dual Language Program and you would like him/her to have second language exposure, the sooner it is started the better!

Did you know that as of right now, there is no Spanish or other World Language option available to Swope Middle schoolers? The Dual Language Advisory Council has been working with Swope Middle School to re-establish Spanish as a class at the middle school level for students of all language development stages.
