Thank you in advance to all those attending our Bingo Night and for those students who participated in the Talent Show. There are so many things happening this spring! A huge shout out too for all of our students who have worked so hard on their SBAC and MAP testing as well. We are very proud of all the students' efforts!

Both Mrs. Waters and Mrs. C shared in their portion of the newsletter all the positive behavioral incentives and supports we have been working on since we have returned from Spring Break. These include a school wide re-teaching behavioral assembly, reviewing our school wide and playground rules, and reviewing our dress code as well. The assembly went well and all students were very attentive!

We are continuing to see enrollment of students who have been home schooled since Covid and many of our students have been exposed to severe trauma and other outside stressors in their young lives completely out of their control. Since we have seen an increase of behaviors in different areas and aspects of the school day, it has been imperative to address these concerns. This year our staff has engaged in the following school wide trainings to support their understanding of how trauma affects the brain and student behavior and how they as educators can support their students in and out of the classroom.

Then as a staff during Leadership team meetings and weekly grade level MTSS meetings we also discuss behavior and look at our Tier 1, Tier 2 and Tier 3 supports and determine what necessary steps must be taken to give the required level of support needed for a student.

As you can see, I am guiding and supporting the staff in a multitude of ways when it comes dealing with behavior and the high level of trauma exposure support and care some of our students require and need, while still doing everything that we can to provide a safe and respectful learning environment for all. It is Imperative however that behavior plans are implemented with fidelity and data collection is taken in order to meet the needs of our students. It obviously takes a village, and we appreciate the support from our family community.

Counseling update from Mrs. C

I hope everyone enjoyed their Spring Break and time off from school as we inch closer and closer to the end of this school year! Since returning from break, I have been wrapping up my Guidance Lessons for April which includes teaching SHARE to all 4th and 5th grade students and continuing my lessons in every class school wide on self-regulation. When I complete this topic, I will be rolling out a whole unit on the topic of CAREERS. This is a topic that doesn't get a ton of attention at the elementary level, and it is my goal to change that! This year, I plan to do an entire week of CAREER DRESS UP days as well as plan an assembly centered around different occupations!

We also had a welcome back assembly for all grade levels to reteach behavior expectations and school rules since many of our younger students haven't had this opportunity since Covid began – it went great, and I am so proud to say I have seen an increase in positive behaviors school wide! During the assembly, I shared an update regarding our "BEAR PAW STORE". We met with our Leadership Team and decided to revamp our Bear Paw store to make the incentives more motivating and rewarding for students. We will no longer be doing an actual "store". Instead, we have formed a new list of rewards that students may earn every 2 weeks on Wednesdays just like we did with the store. Teachers and students will know what the reward is ahead of time (our first one is an extra recess) so students can save up their paws – all rewards will cost 20 Bear Paws each!

Clinic Corner

The 22/23 school year finish line is in sight and temperatures are on the rise!

With that said, it's time to be Sun Smart! SLIP on sun protective clothes, SLOP on sunscreen, SLAP on a hat, SEEK shade or shelter, SLIDE on sunglasses! And STAY hydrated!

Other safety measures to keep in mind is bicycle safety, always wearing a proper helmet, proper shoes, and well-maintained bicycle. If your student does ride their bike to school, please remind them to be aware of others on the road as it's very busy in the morning and dismissal time!

Also, please make sure your student is wearing appropriate, supportive footwear to school. Shoes that they can run and kick in, we see a lot of toe and ankle injuries in the Health Office this time of year.

Over the summer, please review your student's immunization records to make sure they stay current, otherwise exclusions will be made if they are non-compliant. Any immunization exemptions are to be applied for every school year. Also, if medications are needed at school, check that their prescriptions are current and not expired. A new medical form must be submitted every year. Please call the Health Office with any questions.

Another school year of changes has come and gone, Nurse Janet and I would like to thank you for your continued support and patience as policies and protocols are ever changing.

- Student's full name and grade level must be neatly printed ON THE BACK of the design in PENCIL






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
