I hope you all had a restful and relaxing Fall Break! I cannot believe that the 1st Nine Weeks of the school year are behind us! Thank you for a great opening and 1st quarter. It has been so nice to truly have a "normal" year so far! Granted....we had some smoke, but once it cleared out it has been so nice and the rain too! Thank you for supporting our Fall Fundraisers as well: Charleston Wrap, Spirit Wear and our Apex Jog-A-Thon. Our students had so much fun running and the event was wonderful! It was so great to have perfect weather too!

We are looking so forward to bringing back our very loved, traditional Scarecrow Festival. This year, the event will be on Wednesday, October 19th starting at 2:30. I know this newsletter will inform you of all the activities and events, so I would like to send an advanced shout out to all of our parent volunteers, our teachers and our PFA for making this year's Scarecrow Contest such a continued success! A special shout out goes to Cheri Valentine and her committee for organizing this wonderful Jessie Beck tradition. We cannot do this without so many wonderful parent volunteers!

Our Leadership Team is in the process of creating our annual goals for our School Performance Plan. While the state has taken a "pause" with the Star Rating system, I am very proud to share that Jessie Beck received an overall score of 92.0. The last two years we received scores of 91 and prior to that a 95.5 9(pre-Covid), so we continue to do great work! This score is based on multiple factors when our 3rd-6th grade students take the annual SBAC Summative Assessments every spring: growth of our students in both Math and ELA, Academic Achievement in both Math and ELA, Opportunity Gaps in ELA and Math, our ACCESS scores for our EL learners and finally Student Engagement which encompasses Chronic Absenteeism. Chronic Absenteeism is an area that I know we can improve on. We received a 6/10 this past year. As a staff, we will continue to brainstorm ideas to make sure our students are coming to school. It definitely takes the support of our families as well and why routines are so important to young children. What they are learning now with coming to school on a daily basis will only transfer to their work ethic and success in their future.

I just want to say great job to all of our students on their SBAC and thank you for the commitment, dedication and encouragement you provide to your child everyday! Continue to have open communication with your teachers if you have any concerns with your child's progress and check Infinite Campus if you have questions about assignments. If you need assistance logging in, you can always call our front office. Fall Conference Week is October 21st-24th-27th. Friday, October 28th is the Nevada Day holiday.

New Trees

About six or so years ago, during one of our strong drought winters, a few of our larger maple trees died that both provided shade and beauty to the parking lot. Luckily, plans began last year to try to get a few donated. The first week of school Jessie Beck lucked out, as three families each donated a tree. Shovels began coming into school and many students in Dr. Brock's class spent several recesses digging holes. Dr. Brock and Mr. Newman took turns taking about six student volunteers per recess out to dig.

"It was actually very similar to the book Holes, by Louis Sachar," recalled Dr. Brock. The mid-day sun belted down from above, no breezes to cool them down, sweat dripping (honestly), and yet the students never complained. Actually, they constantly talked about how surprised they were that digging holes was so much fun. Recess after recess, most of the same students begged to be the volunteers to dig.

The soil (rocks and clay actually) was so bad in one hole that water had to be poured in night after night, letting it sit, so that a pick ax could loosen it for the shovels to remove. Eventually the hole was dug even deeper then needed and wonderful compost from the garden was loaded by students into a wheelbarrow and used to create a nice five-inch base below the tree to help the roots get established. Diggers of another hole were surprised to find a giant bolder halfway down that was unable to be moved or broken, resulting in the hole shifting to one side.

The result of all this fun work, three beautiful trees planted to provide new greenery and shade for countless years to come. Thank you to the Hitti family for donating the maple, the Ball family for the oak, and the Weed family for the pear tree. Thanks for keeping us shady!


¡Del 15 de septiembre al 15 de octubre es el Mes de la Herencia Hispana!
